Want to help your community?

Buckland and Chipping Parish Council has up to six Parish Councillors and spends an annual budget of more than £10,000. There are currently four Parish Councillors and we are looking for two new recruits.

The role of the Council is wide-ranging, from discussing planning applications and organising village events, to improving health and well-being and lobbying on local issues. The role is interesting and we all have the satisfaction of contributing to the life and well-being of the village.

We are supported in our work by our clerk. We generally meet on Monday evenings, usually seven times a year. From April to October we meet in St Andrew's Church in Buckland and during the winter months we meet in Buntingford at the Town House. No Councillors receive payment for their time.

To be eligible to stand as a Councillor you must be:

- British or a citizen of the Commonwealth.
- Aged 18 years or over.
- In at least one of the following categories:
- a) on the Electoral Register for the parish;

b) have lived in (or within 3 miles of) the parish for at least a year; and/or

c) have had your main place of work within the parish for at least a year.
